Magic Letters: What Are They?

Magic Letters ("MagLets") are "Meaningful Letters."

According to "Magic Letter" Theory (see languagebazaar.com), the first consonant letter (in any word in any language) is an "Icon" (a picture) of the meaning of the whole word.

For example:

The MagLet C looks like it's "Catching" the rest of the word, to Collect it. This MagLet suggests the meanings of: Cup, Cap, Chair. Spanish Casa 'house,' & Comer 'to eat.' For example,

The MagLet M meaning 'TOGETHER' in Hebrew & Italian.
